Lois Custalow Carter represented the Mattaponi Indian Tribe at the first Advisory Committee kickoff Meeting on Wednesday, September 19, 2023, in Gloucester County, Virginia. Attendees were Carol Steele (Gloucester County Administrator), Gloucester Board of Supervisors, Virginia Forestry representatives, DCR staff, and several other Virginia Indian tribal citizens. Topic of discussion included the Machicomoco State Park master planning, schedules, process, vision, purpose, and goals that were shared by several Virginia Park and DCR staff members. Future ongoing meetings will include details about Economic and Environmental progress, along with preservation of Natural Heritage resources.

Powhatan Algonquian Roundtable Committee

Chief Mark T. Custalow and Lois Custalow Carter attended the monthly, Powhatan Algonquian Intertribal language roundtable committee meeting on Saturday, September 16, 2023.

The **Powhatan Algonquian** language community is made up of eight Tribes located in the Tidewater and Potomac River regions of Virginia, together comprised of approximately 6,000 citizens. The language takes its name from the Powhatan Chieftaincy, which unified several tribes under the leadership of Powhatan before the English contact. Today, the communities whose ancestral language is Powhatan Algonquian, include **two state and six federally recognized tribes** in Virginia: the Chickahominy Indian Tribe, Chickahominy Indian Tribe Eastern Division, Mattaponi Indian Tribe, Nansemond Indian Nation, Pamunkey Indian Tribe, Patawomeck Indian Tribe, Rappahannock Indian Tribe, and Upper Mattaponi Indian Tribe. The Strategic Plan has been ongoing to develop a sustainable Powhatan Algonquian Language Program available to benefit Algonquian-speaking Tribes across the

Commonwealth of Virginia and the United States. Goals include a 3-year program designed to set the stage for fluency.

Powhatan Algonquian Roundtable Committee Continued

One of our own, Ian Custalow (Enrolled Mattaponi Tribal Citizen), is one of 4 consultants supporting this project. These four individuals have committed to building capacity within Virginia Algonquian communities as Language Ambassadors to help determine the best ways to use these new resources to teach and learn the Powhatan Algonquian Language within Tribal Communities. Ian is an IT professional and former U.S. Army linguist who has spent the past 20+ years employing his linguistic skills of our language. He has also been involved in numerous historical collections of the Powhatan Algonquian language, and attended the Breath of Life Institute for Indigenous Languages in Washington D.C.
