Federal Recognition Update

On November 7th, 2024, Chief Mark, Tribal Council members, five previous Federal Recognition Petition Office staff, three Kenah consultants, and our Attorney delivered the Mattaponi Indian Tribe and Reservation's Petition to the Office of Interior in Washington, D.C. And met with the Director of the Office of Federal Acknowledgment and several representatives.

Goals and Objectives were met at the end of the 36-month period of the Administration for Native Americans (ANA) awarded grant.

Grant administrative activities included completed applications, creation of multiple trackers for enrollment, archival, and collection documentation, progress and budget reporting, monthly grantee meetings, to name a few project initiatives.

Chief Mark and the Mattaponi Tribal Council would like to "Thank the Petition team who worked diligently on our tribal Petition over the past 3- years. Also, the Chief and Council would like to "Thank anyone who participated in oral interviews, collection, archival activities, and anyone who contributed to our tribal success in completing this project".



Tribal Council Election

This is a notification that the Mattaponi Tribal Council Election will be coming up soon. According to the Mattaponi Indian Tribe's Constitution, three Tribal Council members and Assistant Chief will be voted on by lineal tribal resident citizens. Guidelines will be forth coming to residents who are eligible to vote.

With so many projects and initiatives taking place with our Tribal affairs, it has been difficult to conduct a virtual meeting with all tribal enrolled citizens of the Mattaponi Indian Tribe. 
Opportunity for Artists

November's Water Monitoring

Water monitoring was collected from our Mattaponi River on November 6th, for high tide monitoring and again on November 19th, for low tide monitoring.

We will be collecting December's water monitoring samples on Wednesday, December 4th from 12pm-2pm for our high tide monitoring and again on Monday, December 9th from 12pm-2pm for our low tide monitoring. If a tribal citizen would like to help with completing our monthly water samples, please visit the Environmental Office on that scheduled day. All supplies will be provided, please allow 2 hours of your time.

Update on the Mattaponi Shoreline Restoration Project

The final report for the archaeological study has been completed and submitted to the relevant agencies for review. Once they have reviewed the report and provided any feedback, the Environmental Department will be able to move forward with obtaining the necessary permits and beginning the initial stages of construction.

Caroline County Water Intake/Discharge Project Updates

Previously mentioned in the October tribal newsletter, the permit to withdraw 7.9 million gallons per day (mgd), with a maximum of 13.9 mgd, of water from the Rappahannock River to supply the Caroline County data center project has been suspended. In response to this, a new study will be submitted to the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) proposing a revised withdrawal of 5.1 mgd, with a maximum of 7.9 mgd, to support the project.

A DEQ board meeting has been scheduled for December 4th, 2024, to discuss these updates. The Environmental Department will attend this meeting and then share the updates with tribal members during the next monthly Tribal meeting and in the December Newsletter.

In addition to ongoing discussions regarding the water discharge permit, there has been no further information provided about a second public hearing for the discharge permit related to the recycled and treated wastewater being released into the Mattaponi River. The first public hearing was held on September 25th, and the comment period for the discharge permit closed on October 11th.
